

1. Project Benefits

- A. Priority is accorded in projects refereeing and presentation to implementation or funding committees.
- B. Priority in untilization of equipment and services of the General Facility Projects, Research Units and Laboratories of Kuwait University.
- C. Allowing hiring of up to (2) permanent manpower.

2. Researcher Incentives

- A. Allowing scientific missions or inviting visiting expert each year of the project. One mission may be given to attend a conference without presenting a paper, or to visit a Research Institute.
- B. If the evaluation of the Final Report is rated as distinguished (*recieved an excellent score*), the PI is awarded the following incentives:
 - Cerificate of Merit.
 - A financial reward of KD 1000/- (PI), and KD 500/- for each Co. I.
